NCAA Initial-Eliqibility Standards

All college sports are divided into three categories, Division I, II, and III, which range from most to least competitive. In order to play Division I or II sports in the freshman year of college, a student must first become academically eligible with the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Eligibility Center. Academic eligibility is determined by a student's NCAA Approved Core Course high school grade point average (converted to the 4.0 scale) and SAT or ACT scores. For Division III, there are no academic eligibility requirements to play sports besides gaining acceptance into the college.

Prospective Division I or II student-athletes *must* complete the following steps:

- Make an appointment with your school counselor and discuss the following:
 - o Your intention to play Division I or II sports in college
 - o Academic NCAA initial-eligibility standards
 - Determining whether you may be eligible by completing a NCAA eligibility worksheet listing your current and future courses and grades as compared to NCAA requirements.
- Visit <u>www.eligibilitycenter.org</u> and <u>www.2point3.org</u> to register and obtain more information regarding eligibility.
