Summer Internships

The Brooklyn-Queens-Long Island Area Health Education Center (BQLI-AHEC) Summer Health Internship Program (SHIP) is a six-week opportunity for underrepresented and/or economically disadvantaged high school and college students. This program exposes students to a variety of careers in the health field as well as various health issues affecting their communities.

The Summer Health Internship Program (SHIP) runs from . For six weeks, selected participants are committed to work at their designated clinic or hospital for three days (3) a week from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM. In addition, there will be a mandatory workshop once a week.

The workshops will encompass a full and will include: health related lectures, job readiness skills, field trips, and other health related activities. Selected participants are also required to take part of a team collaborated health themed project. At the end of the program, the participants will be required to attend a mandatory closing ceremony, and present his/her final project.

Long Island Aquarium (LIA) offers internship opportunities with the Aquarium's education department. The mission of the high school internship program is to expose the student to various aspects of marine science through the perspective of the marine educator. Individual research and observation is encouraged in order to convey informed background information on the Aquarium's creatures and their native habitats. Interns are teamed up with an education staff member who will act as a mentor throughout the internship experience. Aside from showing the intern the ins and outs of education at LIA, mentors provide personal experience on the pursuit of a career in marine science and promote a sense of direction in this varied and widening field. Interns will choose a day of the week where they are able to commit at least six hours on a regular basis. Weekend hours are available. LIA is open year-round except for Christmas Day. Transportation is the responsibility of the intern. Interns will be introduced to their mentor on the first day of their internship. Internships last a minimum of 120 hours or follow the school's requirements if different from LIA. All LIA internships are unpaid. Past projects completed by high school interns include an educational display about coral reefs, a scavenger hunt for high school visitors, toddler and pre-k lessons about sea turtles and seahorses, and observing seals and otters to gather data on their swimming patterns in their exhibit. Students interested in applying for the program should send the following materials: a brief resume with contact information including any work, volunteer experience, and school activities, a brief letter of interest explaining why they would like to intern at LIA, and a letter of recommendation from a teacher, guidance counselor, school administrator, or an adult other than a parent, guardian, or relative.
