Description	Deer Park High School's Pumpkin-Chunkin team The Dark Falcons has competed in competitions from New Hampshire to Pennsylvania for over 10 years to see how far we can throw a 3-8 lb pumpkin using our student designed and built catapult. The Dark Falcons have placed at the top of our division every year. Teams had to design and construct a catapult or other mechanical propulsion device to toss a 3-to-8-pound pumpkin farther than their competitors. Deer Park's formidable catapult – technically classified as a trebuchet – has the power to launch the pumpkins close to 2,000 feet with considerable velocity. The design, construction, training and operation of the catapults uses math, physics, construction, and engineering concepts come to life for the participating students in a tangible and exciting way, and engendering a strong sense of teamwork and cooperation. This is a hands on club where all members contribute to the design and construction of this machine. We compete primarily around Halloween and meet mainly on Saturdays including over the summer to update our machine.
